In these tumultuous times, I invite you to remember that we are all beloved children of God. We sit side by side in the pews, and yet we differ in our opinions and beliefs of many things. In a recent interfaith panel about how our faith can heal the nation, I spoke about how the strength of Presbyterians is our unity in diversity.

And yet, this can quickly become a weakness if we diverge away from our respect and care for one another. We follow Christ together loving, respecting and trusting one another. Trust is a commodity that has unfortunately become rare in society today. Do you trust that your fellow congregants are focused on Christ in their lives when their actions and politics differ from yours? Do you trust that they truly and deeply care about Manassas Presbyterian Church even if they show it in ways that you don't understand?

Because the world around us is in a stew of mistrust where vitriolic and adversarial interactions are becoming the norm, mistrust is creeping into our beloved community. Can we listen, respect and love one another even stronger now? I call us back to what our MPC mission says is central to us as a community:

We believe God calls us to reflect Christ's love and mercy by

- WORSHIPING as a community of diverse ages, backgrounds and cultures;
- **ENGAGING** the whole congregation in fellowship, learning, service, and outreach to the wider community;
- SERVING by carring for each other and reaching out to the world God loves, seeking to understand and respond to needs;
- **GROWING** as individuals, families, and community as we continue to discover who we are in Jesus Christ; and trying to follow his example.

On the first page of our church web page, we say: "We are a warm and welcoming congregation and we invite you to join us!

We are part of the Presbyterian Church (USA), grounded in the Reformed tradition, yet the vast majority of us have come from other denominations and faith practices, drawn by lively worship, superb music, exceptional learning opportunities, a commitment to service, and joyful life. We are a diverse group sharing a common faith and we take great pride in our 150-year history even as we eagerly embrace God's unfolding future."

Where is this future taking us together? What unites us is Christ and that is stronger than anything that seeks to divide us - ³⁰ Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." - Mark 12:30-31


From The Loving Hands Prayer Shawl Ministry




This ministry is a yearlong group of dedicated creators of not only shawls but also hats and scarves. Here is Julie checking on the hat size. Looking good, Julie.

Weekend Food for Kids (WFFK) - Year in Review

For the first time since its startup, the WFFK Mission Program packed for <u>three</u> elementary schools, <u>Sudley</u>, which was our first school, <u>Westgate</u>, which started one year later and then this year, our neighbor, <u>Innovation</u> became our third school. For the 2024-2025 school year we packed gallon bags of non-perishable food items for 150 students for the weekend beginning in October 2024 and ending June 2025. In eight separate setups and packings during the year, we as a Congregation packed 4950 bags (3400 last year). Additionally, we packed over 1800 snack bags (1200 last year) of cheddar fish to assist teachers with snacks for students in need. Each gallon bag contained 16 food items and a positive message favor. From a time perspective: For Pre-setup, six people setup tables and counted food items to set out on the tables for a total of 12 hours; for Setup, ten to twelve people opened boxes, placed the food items in larger containers, and broke down the boxes for recycling for a total of 16 hours; and for Packing, 30 to 40 people, including the youth, placed items in gallon food bags and placed them in larger containers for delivery to the schools and reset the rooms for a total of 12 hours to complete all the packings for the school year. Amazing work everyone! CONGRATULATIONS, and THANK YOU!

Feeding Friends is Now SERVING FRIENDS

As noted in the May newsletter, the Gainesville United Methodist Church (GUMC) clothing truck, affectionately known as Mildred, could no longer be repaired. GUMC has been looking to purchase another vehicle to continue their ministry. MPC helped to support this effort by donating the proceeds (\$1300) of the free will offering collected during our Asian Potluck that included entertainment from our very own Kelly Glyptis and Deborah Panell. Well, GUMC has found and purchased a truck to support their mission and with this purchase have changed the name of the mission from "Feeding Friends" to <u>Serving Friends</u>, which will soon be painted on the sides of the truck. In the meantime, GUMC has already put her into action (the truck's new name is Getrude or "Gertie")!

Serving Friends comes to the MPC parking lot every Tuesday from 3PM to 5PM to serve individuals in need. They provide clothes and other items, like blankets and toiletries, in addition to a bagged lunch and bottled water.

In addition to the monthly picnics, MPC can help GUMC by providing any of the following, either directly to the clothing truck or by putting the items in the identified basket in the Vestibule:

Needs for men and women-all sizes (no kids sizes please):

- ⇒ New or gently used T-shirts, jeans, leggings, hoodies, sweatshirts, athletic shorts or pants, sneakers/boots/sturdy shoes, backpacks, coats and jackets
- ⇒ New: underwear and sports bras
- ⇒ Blankets, sleeping bags, flashlights

Gatorade and Nutri-grain type bars are also welcomed items.

A huge THANK YOU to the entire congregation for supporting this important ministry of "helping the Least of the These"! The Mission Team continues to ask that you keep the MPC mission programs in your prayers.

Also, the formerly known as *Serving Our Neighbors* mobile unit is now in the church parking lot under Prince William County Social Services and is open on Thursdays from 3PM to 6PM to provide services to those individuals who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of being homeless.
