That future may not look like the church of our childhood. As a people of the resurrection, we should expect the unexpected and be ready to step out in faith for where Christ is leading next.

September will have opportunities for service in Weekend Food For Kids packing and blood donating; as well as discipleship as our classes, choirs and programs kickoff for the school year; and fellowship - time to be together in food, fun and dance! As we are reminded at communion - This cup is the New Covenant of my blood shed for the forgiveness of sins. Drink of it in remembrance of me. Christ loves us that much - has enough faith to nudge and challenge us to love more and be more so Christ's light and hope shine out from this place.







## Presbyterian Women

September is here and Presbyterian Women will begin a new Bible study. Bible study is the glue that holds Presbyterian Women together and the women of MPC are no exception. We have three Circles that gather "to nurture faith through prayer and Bible study," which is part of the Purpose of Presbyterian Women across the world. The 2025-2026 Horizons Bible Study, *Finding Resilience*, *Joy, and Our Identity in Jesus Christ* by Rhashell D. Hunter with Suggestions for Leaders by Joyce MacKichan Walker will be the study for all three Circles this year.



Here's the description of the Introduction of the 2025-2026 Horizons Bible Study:

In this Bible study, we will explore resilience. This is modeled for us by several biblical characters, gospel and epistle writers, as well as Jesus. So, what exactly is resilience? Resilience is the ability to spring back into shape and to adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or stress—such as from family, relationships, health, workplace, and financial stressors. People who survive and thrive well in change are resilient. The Bible study is also about joy. How do we find joy in a chaotic world? Christian joy may be different from how a lot of people define joy.

Joy is sometimes confused with happiness. For Christians, joy can occur while we are in the midst of difficult circumstances. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded by love and followed by peace (Gal 5:22-23). Trusting in God when we are in trying times can fill us with glorious joy and peace. We have joy in our suffering, because ultimately our joy is found in Jesus Christ. We will also seek to rediscover our identity. Identity is more than who we are or who we show ourselves to be. At its core, it points to our humanity. Our core identity is not found in our titles, our positions, our spouses, our partners, or our possessions. For Christians, our identity is found in Jesus Christ.

The Circles will hold their first meetings as follows: September 2nd at 10AM with Martha Circle; September 16th at Noon with Alpha-Agape Circle; and September 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7PM with Covenant Renewal Circle.

## News from Weekend Food for Kids (WFFK) Mission Program

The first packing of the 2025-2026 school year is September 21 after worship service with setup on Saturday, September 20 at 9:30AM in the Fellowship Hall. We will be supporting 160 students: 50 students at Sudley and WestGate Elementary Schools and 60 students at Innovation Elementary School, our neighbor. This first packing will be for five weeks in October for a total of 800 gallon bags containing nonperishable food items for the kids for the weekend. There will be eight more setup and packing events this school year. Mark your calendars!

School supplies and cheddar fish snacks were sorted and packed after worship on August 17<sup>th</sup>. Over 960 snack bags of cheddar fish were packed to help support the teachers at the three schools MPC supports. Thanks to everyone who helped and a huge shout out to Julie Mahoney for her leadership on the school supplies effort! See the school supplies article in this newsletter for more details.

We need your help with the positive message favors that go into each gallon food bag for the coming year and the following year.

#### For this year's favors we need:

By October 1<sup>st</sup> we will need 18 bags of 20 oz candy corn and 9 bags of 11 oz candy pumpkins. (The candy is for the November turkey topper snack bag favor)

#### For the 2026-2027 October favor we will need:

An assortment of plastic bugs no bigger than two inches, for example a spider ring and/or glow in the dark bugs. Since Halloween is right around the corner it would be a good time to find and buy them. Whatever you can find would be greatly appreciated!

Other ways the congregation can support this program are by bringing boxes of Rice Krispie Bars (60 or 40 bars) and Fruit Gummies (40 or 90 packages) and placing them in the big yellow bin in the Narthex or you can give financially, noting "WFFK-Food" on your donation, either written or electronic.

We continue to be amazed by the support of the congregation for this program supporting kids in need. Thank you for are in for sharing Christ's love!

At the Early Learning Center, we believe every child is a unique and precious child of God.

The week ended with Teacher Meet & Greets, allowing students to come in and meet their teachers, explore their classrooms and play with some new toys and friends.
