

New Mission Ministry

The Mission Team is initiating a Blessing Box Ministry for our neighbors in need. The Blessing Box is a "take what you need, leave what you can" ministry providing food and other essentials for living to those in need. It also allows an opportunity for our neighbors to join in the ministry by contributing specific non-perishable food items for those less fortunate than themselves.

The blessing box will be installed in the parking lot near the entrance to the church. The box will initially be stocked with non-perishable food only. Once our neighbors are comfortable with using the box, we will include useful hygiene and personal care items as well. The contents of the box will change as appropriate for the seasons. The list of acceptable items for donation will be posted on the mission bulletin board and will be updated throughout the year as the seasons change.

This is an opportunity for the entire congregation to contribute needed items throughout the year. We are also seeking volunteers to check and restock the blessing box as needed throughout the year. A sign -up sheet will be posted in the narthex if you want to volunteer to help monitor blessing box use.

Food donations for the blessing box can be placed in the food cart we use for the Haymarket food bank support, and appropriate items will be selected from that cart as needed for the Blessing Box.



From The Loving Hands Prayer Shawl Ministry



Stephen Ministry

What Does it Take to Become a Stephen Minister (and What Do You Receive in Return)?

In 2026, MPC will be training additional Stephen Ministers. Stephen Ministry may have crossed your mind a few times and now you want to take a closer look at the idea of becoming a Stephen Minister. You're wondering: Is this right for me? You may have even felt God's tap on your shoulder, but you still aren't sure. Following is some information that might help you as you prayerfully consider this important ministry.

"I'm not qualified to be a Stephen Minister." What qualifications are necessary to be a Stephen Minister? You need to be a caring person who is willing to learn, grow, and serve. You must be willing and able to maintain confidentiality. You need to make a commitment to training, ministry, and supervision (Small Group Peer Supervision). If you meet those qualifications, your Stephen Leaders will equip you with the rest of what you need: training, support, encouragement, care, and prayers.

"I don't know what to say or do in a ministry situation." Stephen Ministry training is thorough and practical. Each Stephen Minister completes 50 plus hours of training before ever meeting with a care receiver. The training includes listening, dealing with feelings, assertiveness, confidentiality, maintaining boundaries, how to begin and end caring relationships, and how to care for people who are grieving, dying, aging, divorcing, and experiencing many other life crises. The goal of training is to prepare Stephen Ministers for whatever they might encounter when working with care receivers. After being assigned to a care receiver, Stephen Ministers participate in continuing education and Supervision Group sessions. This is where they care for and support one another and sharpen their caregiving skills. Most Stephen Ministers have only one care receiver at a time. They typically meet once a week with their care receivers for about an hour at a time. They may also check in with their care receivers throughout the week by telephone or text, particularly when the care receiver is going through a difficult time.

Dedicated Service. A Stephen Minister serves wholeheartedly. This isn't a casual ministry. It involves prayer, thought, consideration, study, and commitment. You may be thinking, "I don't have enough time to be a Stephen Minister." There's a way in which that is true for everyone—time is a precious commodity. As a matter of fact, time is so precious that it only makes sense to use it on activities that make a real difference—in others' lives as well as in your own life. When you make the commitment to be a Stephen Minister, you will find the hours you need to devote to it. Stephen Ministry becomes a priority among the many activities you're involved in. The commitment is significant, but so is the contribution you will be making to serve God.


Accountability. A Stephen Minister is accountable to God, the congregation, the Stephen Leaders, the other Stephen Ministers, and the care receiver and in return, he or she receives support, encouragement, and guidance in Small Group Peer Supervision.

Continuous Learning. A Stephen Minister is open to adjusting and adapting his or her caregiving to fit the needs of the care receiver. He or she learns more about caregiving at each meeting with a care receiver and at each supervision session. Stephen Ministry is an experience of continuous learning, growth, and joy.

Applications to become a Stephen Minister will be accepted in November and December of this year. Applications will be available in the Narthex and the Church office. Please place the completed application in the Stephen Ministry box in the office or give it to one of our Stephen Leaders (Gene Barndt, Jeff Shriver or Kathy Massie). Each applicant will be interviewed during the month of January, and selections will be made by the end of January. If you would like to know more about this important ministry, please contact Gene (703-489-4306), Jeff (703 -926-2045) or Kathy (703-608-5492). The Holy Spirit may be calling you to the joy, commitment, growth, training, service, and care of being a Stephen Minister. Pray for God's guidance as you consider this opportunity.



- ⇒ Sneakers, boots, or other sturdy shoes;
- ⇒ Backpacks, coats, and jackets;
- ⇒ New underwear and sports bras;
- ⇒ Blankets, sleeping bags, flashlights with batteries.

We will accept other donations, such as children's clothes, and ask that they be labeled accordingly.

News from Weekend Food for Kids (WFFK) Mission Program

First, a huge THANK YOU to everyone who made the first packing go so smoothly! From the presetup team (renamed to Staging Team), the bag labelers, favor makers and organizers, to all who packed and delivered 800 bags of nonperishable food items for 160 students at three elementary schools. We've only just begun! We have <u>two more packings left in 2025</u>: **November 2** for four weeks and **November 22** for 3 weeks. Look for more information in eBlasts and worship slides. Early Learning Center


